At Chrysalis, we have always been a family. This year our Chrysalis family worked diligently to provide the highest level of services to our clients and community.

In September of 2023, Chrysalis completed our recertification as a **Trauma Informed Certified Organization**. Becoming a trauma-informed agency means making a commitment to changing the practices, policies, and culture of an entire organization. Chrysalis holds the status as one of the leaders in our field through our network connections, workgroup involvement, and DV community collaborations. As such, with this recertification, Chrysalis plans to continue taking steps forward in TIC integration within our organization to further our impact in the community we serve and to grow the skills of our team.

To a survivor of domestic violence, belief means everything. This year, Chrysalis held our first annual **Believe Gala**. Events like Believe show victims of domestic violence that you believe them—that you believe in the value of their lives and their futures. You're giving them hope, reminding them what it feels like to believe in themselves. This year, we were able to raise over \$280,000 to help people who are impacted by domestic violence.

Every winter, Chrysalis holds our **Winter Wonderland** for our clients. Not only does the staff coordinate the celebration at Shelter, but Wonderland also extends to our community-based clients. 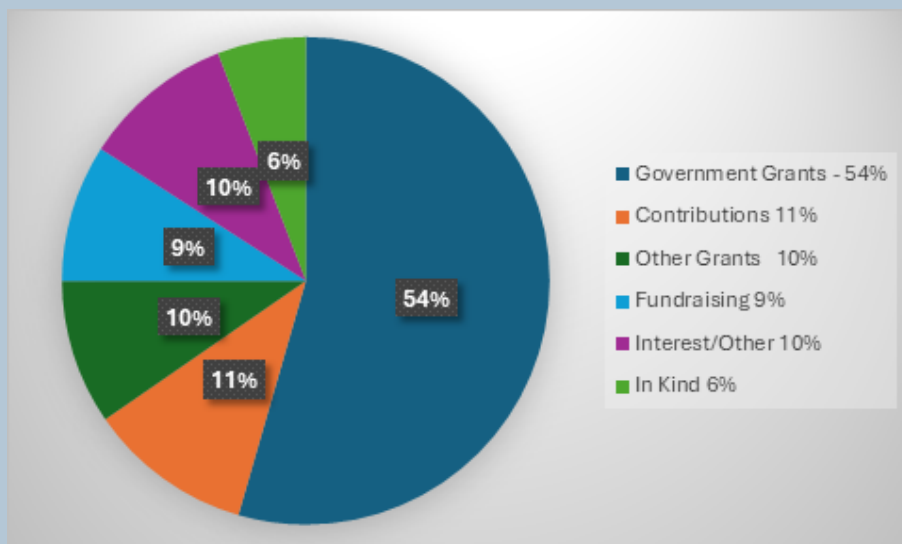

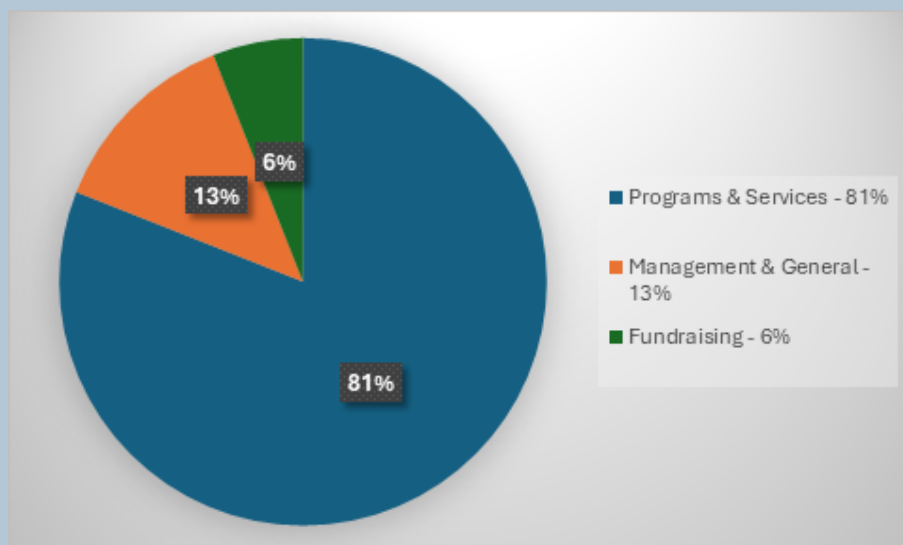
